First Steps and Foundation

Class 4

This week in Class 4 we have been learning about buoyancy – we created our own plasticine vessels and then saw how much mass they could carry – congratulations to Bella and Becca for designing a boat which could carry 218g of weight. We have also been learning the power of persuasion by writing letters to Miss Hurford, local businesses and the council. In maths we have been trying to go deep into mastery when looking at addition and subtraction – ask us about the bar method and the part whole!
