Oak Class (Reception and Year 1)


What a fantastic Sports Week Oak Class have had. In the afternoons, we have been taking part in a variety of sporting activities including; yoga, gym, and balancability. In English, we finished our unit on the book 'Stanley's Stick' and we have been writing our own versions. In maths, Reception have been learning to share objects between different groups to make equal groups. Year 1 have focused their work on fractions. They started sharing objects into halve and quarters and then moved on to saying what a half a quarter was for a given number. We ended the week brilliantly with Sports Day and all of the children should feel really proud of their effort.



Cedar Class (Years 1 and 2)

We have had another busy week in Cedar Class this week. As it has been Sports Week, we have enjoyed taking part in lots of new sports including yoga, hockey, gym and even archery!

We have also been writing our own, imaginative stories based on our book 'Stanley's Stick'. The children have used their brilliant imaginations to come up with their own version of the story, using lots of adjectives, adverbs and apostrophes! Finally, we have been consolidating our knowledge of fractions by practising finding halves and quarters. A fantastic week of work was topped off with an incredible sports day! Well done Cedar!



Beech Class (Years 3 and 4)

Beech Class have enjoyed a marvellous two weeks at school! The children have continued their exploration of the strange Iron Man sighting and met the main character in class! From this, they have enjoyed creating diary entries and newspaper reports. Within our history topic, the children were lucky enough to see and feel some replica Roman artifacts kindly lent to us from Tiverton Museum. From the artifacts, they discussed how the Romans may have lived, cooked and what games they enjoyed (ask them about the gambling knuckle bones!). Finally, the children have been taking part in a huge range of sporting activities which they have enjoyed immensely. The activities have ranged from archery, golf and cricket.



Ash Class (Years 5 and 6)

This week has obviously been all about sports! The children have shown all of the learning powers: trying new sports; helping their team and coaching each other; connecting skills between sports; keeping on going if they found it difficult to begin with; creating games to play; and finding ways to solve problems. They have also continued building their knowledge about portraits - looking at symbolism in Tudor paintings. We also completed our Relationship Sex Education sessions and have encouraged children to talk about any questions or queries they have with a trusted adult. We also still completed our Code to the Future session with Coach Campbell - adding extra levels to their games.
