Cedar Class (Year 1 and 2)

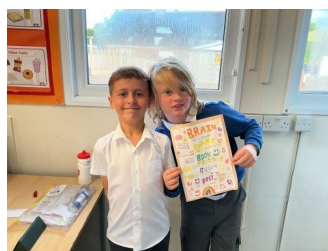
