We made sun shelters and talked about being safe in sunny weather. We have also been exploring emerging maths ideas and sensory play with the sand and water. Our school

Cedar Class (Year 1 and 2)

The weeks are flying by in Cedar! In amongst a fantastically fun filled sports week last week (thank you Mr Snow and all adults coaching); a very exciting moving up morning meeting our new



teachers and a remarkable trip to RHS Rosemoor where we explored the gardens and took part in a wonderful workshop, we've begun looking at our final units of work for the year. In maths, we've been exploring measuring mass and capacity through a range of practical activities and visual sessions. Our final text in English is 'Last Stop on Market Street' and so far we have looked at noun phrases and powerful verbs to create short poems about a bus journey. In history, we've continued our work on the first flights, learning about and comparing the Wright Brothers' 1903 and 1905 flights and discussing how different their planes were to those we see today. We reflected on out trip to Fleet Air Arm Museum when discussing different planes.
