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> Cedar Class (Year 1 and 2) It has been a busy start to our last chapter of the school year. The children enjoyed finding their own special stick as an introduction to our new book 'Stanley's Stick', that we have



begun exploring in English. They have shown great imagination by thinking about what their sticks could be, ranging from lawnmowers to hamsters! In maths, we have continued our topic on time and it has been exciting to see the children making sense of a concept that can be very tricky but one that is an important life skill. Art consisted of designing rainbows using a range of media for the Mid Devon Show competition and some children were taught how to peg loom by Ruby in Y6 who is working on her Bronze Arts Award. In RE, we thought about what makes us unique and special; during which, we discovered some interesting things about our Cedar family.

Beech Class (Years 3 and 4)

The children have returned to school routines and learning exceptionally well, showing both enthusiasm and determination. In maths, they have been making great strides in further developing their un-



derstanding of money and it's wonderful to see them engaging with this important life skill and applying their knowledge in practical ways. The children are also excited about our new Athletics topic and are enjoying further developing their skills in preparation for Sports Day. Additionally, our exciting new Vikings topic has captured the children's imaginations. They are eager to learn about this fascinating period in history and their curiosity is leading to some fantastic discussions.

Ash Class (Years 5 and 6)

We've had a great first week back with the children beginning to learn their roles in the KS2 Production. They have been reading out their roles in characters with many of them beginning to learn their lines off-by-heart already! We have also been focussing on our Relationship and Sex Education sessions; they have been really sensible asking questions and reflecting on what they have learnt. If they do have any questions about what we have learnt, please encourage them to speak to an adult.

We also took a team to the East Devon finals for Quad Kids (an athletics competition centred around 4 events: 75m Sprint, 600m long-distance, standing long jump and vortex throw). We came 8th out of 12 schools with Joe the top placed boy - finishing in 19th place out of 48 and

Ruby the top placed girl who finished 1st overall and she was the only child to achieve the Gold UKA Award out of all 96 children! Most importantly, the children showed great determination and teamwork.
