Cedar Class (Years 1 and 2)

This week has been another busy week to kick start the last half term. We have been learning a poem about trains and we finished the week by learning and performing it to the class. In maths, we have been focusing on adding. The year twos have even starting to use column addition. To finish the week, we have planted some of the plants that



we have grown from seed. Fingers crossed we get lots of produce to harvest. Over the week, year 1 have been working hard completing their phonics screening test! We are so proud of all the hard work they have put in and they all gave it their best.

Beech Class (Years 3 and 4)

Beech Class have thrown themselves into their new English unit, which is all about myths. We've shared lots of myths from different cultures around the world and have learnt and remem-



bered The Hunters and the Great Snake - creating some freeze frames to tell the story too. Over the next few weeks, we'll be looking at the structure and story-telling style of myths before we write our own. In maths, we've revisited geometry and investigated angles in great depth - we even borrowed the protractors from Ash class! We began this term's RE unit by thinking about the things that are wrong with our world at the moment and discussing the small changes we can make to do our bit.

Ash Class (Years 5 and 6)

This week, Ash class have hit the ground running this half term by starting their new book 'The Wolves of Currumpaw' which is set in New Mexico, USA. This links brilliantly with our geography and history topics which are both about North America and the history of Native Americans. In maths, the children have been working on more real-life maths problems by looking at the maths sur-

rounding going on holiday - including temperatures and booking flights. We have also started to rehearse our end of year production.
