# Willow Class (Pre-school)

Hello everybody, we hope you are all well?. There are lots of exciting things happening in Willow class. We are enjoying our Black History Month activities as well as learning all about Autumn in Sampford Pe-



verell and Devon. We are also introducing our Harvest Festival focus and starting to plan activities in linking to being a Christian and in the community.

## Oak Class (Reception and Year 1)

In Oak Class, we have been enjoying talking about and exploring non-fiction texts. We have been looking at how these are structured and the various ways information can be shared. In our maths, we have been using lots of rhymes as we begin to talk about our addition and subtraction. Well done to the Year 1 children for working so hard on using the part-part whole model in your maths this week and for sharing your ideas and understanding so confidently. We have also enjoyed

finding the pulse in our music and looking at colour wheels in our art work. There has also been lots of amazing talk and observations as we continue to learn about the seasons.



## Cedar Class (Years 1 and 2)

This week we have been looking at non-fiction books! We have also been writing in the style of non-fiction books by writing factual sentences about different clothing for different weathers. In maths this



week, we have been focusing on number bonds. To keep practising this at home, have a go at using numbots. In the afternoons, we have been thinking about the seasons and in particular Autumn. We have been discussing Autumnal weather and how things change in Autumn.

## Beech Class (Years 3 and 4)

On Monday, Beech class learnt about the 3 different rock groups; igneous, metamorphic, and sedimentary. We looked at how they are formed through either heat or pressure, or a combination of both, as well as features such as layers, mineral grain size and texture. Using chocolate shavings, we recreated these processes in a

matter of minutes rather than the millions of years it usually takes! We then applied our knowledge to identify and describe 4 common rocks; granite, sandstone, slate and marble.



# Ash Class (Years 5 and 6)

Over the past two weeks, the children of Ash Class have been extremely busy. Year 6 children went on their weeklong outward bound residential with them taking part in many adventurous activities such as abseiling, caving and coasteering. There is a section with further description and photographs in Ash class' section of the school website. At school, the Year 5s were given the opportunity to complete their Bikeability Award - a scheme which helps prepare them to be safe and confident cyclists. Many thanks to Mrs Booth and Mr Maycock who themselves had to persevere through the weather that week. We all were so impressed with he children's confidence, resilience and listening skills. This week in class we have been writing sentences to instruct people on 'How to survive...' with children choosing between Bikeability or Grenville. In science, we have been experimenting with

changing materials by dissolving materials, looking at oxidisation and adding heat. Finally, children from both Beech and Ash class participated in a cross country event which saw them race well over 1 kilometre against over 40 other children in their year group.
