Music Pop Ballads Frank where and May Lave Rap	All the learning in this unit is focused around one song: 'Make you Feel my Love' by Adele. They will use tuned instruments to keep the beat and play along with the music as well as compose their own pieces. Then they will be exploring the world of rap music – in particular, The Fresh Prince of Bel Air	Listen to music at home and talk about it. What instruments are being used? Use words like 'chorus' and 'verse' to identify the structure of songs. Investigate different genres of music and begin to build a library of favourite songs.
Art William Morris	Our art work will be led by Miss Keary and delivered by Mrs Davé and will weave into our topics by presenting ideas through art. This term they will be looking at William Morris – a famed Victorian printer – and how to create a realistic sculpture linked to their chosen biography subject.	Talk to you children about what they are creating in class and if there are any skills they could replicate at home. Keep on the lookout for letters asking for objects which may be useful in class. Do you have any repetitive wallpapers at home? What famous sculptures of famous people are there? Have they always been successful?
Computing Webpage Creation Safer Internet Day	We will be looking at how to create our own webpages linked to Victorians this term with a break in the first week of February to focus on Safer Internet Day or SID. After half term, we will be using spreadsheets to collect and represent data.	When using the Internet at home, consider what you do to stay safe online. Continue to use Scratch at home to produce more games based on last term work. Then, look at using Excel to create your own spreadsheets on home – maybe keep track of your pocket money!
RE Creation and Science	We will be looking at how religion and science are related to each other and whether science conflicts or compliments the story of creation. After that, we will look at Hinduism and in particular what Hindus believe they have to do to be 'good'.	We often upon some really big questions and topics which the children may want to discuss further at home. If they have any questions which you feel you need assistance in answering, encourage them to bring them into school to discuss them.
PE Dance Cet Set 4 P.E. Basketball	Using the Get Set 4 PE scheme, the children will be learning a variety of dance moves. This will be followed by a topic on basketball to continue to build their knowledge of invasion games.
