In maths, we have been learning about time: Reception have been investigating how many jumps, laps or builds they can do in a certain time and Year 1 have been learning how to tell the time to o'clock and half past. if you could continue this learning at home. In RE, Reception have sharing their knowledge of different religious celebrations ready for their topic this term and Year 1 have been looking at the things that make us all unique.

Also the children have enjoyed their first lesson on the Roman Empire – unpicking the key dates and events that form the rise and fall of this great civilisation.

Ash Class (Years 5 and 6)

This week in Ash we have been handing out the final few parts of the play so all the children now know their roles in the play (with maybe a few more added in for good luck as we work through it). The children are already learning their lines and reading with full expression - keep an eye out for costume ideas for each child to wear and if anyone has anything they think will help us in a production, please send it in. In maths this week, we are focusing on real life application of maths; this week we have revised ratio, the four operations and converting units of measurement. In science, we have started our new unit

on forces - investigating the effects of gravity on objects. We also recapped our knowledge of British history by placing events on a timeline before introducing our new unit - The Tudors.
