This week, I have had so many children approach me in the playground to tell me about all the reading and spelling's that they have practised over the Easter. It is fantastic to see so many children enthusiastic about their learning and who value the importance of

practice. I can't emphasis enough how important practice is and would like to take this opportunity to remind you of our homework expectations. All children are expected to practise their reading, spellings and counting (Reception, Year 1 and 2) or times tables (Year 3 to 6 and any confident Year 2s) at least 5 times each week. Next week, teachers will also send out a curriculum overview for the term which will include some home learning opportunities which we encourage you to do with your child but these are optional. I would like to finish by saying how proud I am of one of our pupils. First Steps (Pre-school)

Hello everybody and welcome back to the summer term. We have already started to set up and spend time outside and its especially fun with a "there you are" phonics play session. Its lovely to see everyone and we cannot wait to get started for play and learning in the outside space.



Darwin Class (Reception)

Lewis Class (Years 3 and 4)

In English, we've begun our next unit of work on poetry and have looked lots of different styles of poems all written by Roger McGough. This unit we're thinking about how word choices can affect the feel of a poem, the message it conveys, and how it sounds.

Our topic for the next 2 weeks is friendships and relationships and we've been talking lots about what makes a good friend and reflecting on whether we meet our own expectations of being a good friend.



Drake Class (Years 5 and 6)

This week in Drake Class the children have been learning about Earth Day. In English they have written some Haikus about nature and presented them in the style of our class book 'Earth Verse'. In Maths they have made some fantastic 3D shapes and labelled the properties and have also learnt how to use protractors to measure and draw

angles. We have also started our new PE topic this term which is tennis so it would be great if we could see as many children asking to access the tennis courts in the village!
