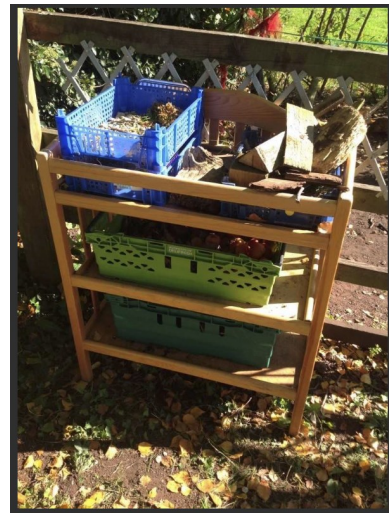

First Steps and Darwin

After several sightings of a spider in the toilet and countless creepy crawlies in our outside area, First Steps and Darwin have been investigating mini beasts! Last week we read the story of "Bug Hunt" and went on our own hunt for insects around school. This week we have read an information book, finding out some incredible facts about mini beasts. (Did you know that butterflies taste their food with their feet?!). We have looked closely at mini beasts, painting detailed pictures, complete with labels and even made a super bug hotel, complete with swimming pool.



Seacole

Seacole class have enjoyed looking at all sorts of animals; we have been learning to recognise and name the features of reptiles, amphibians, mammals, insects, birds and fish. We've also been looking at their diets and working out what makes animals a carnivore, omnivore or herbivore. In maths, we have started addition and subtraction; our first area to practise was our numbers bonds to 10, 20 and 100. See if they can remember any at home! In English, we have had a fantastic end to our narrative unit; we finished the week with a whole day of being authors, writing our own stories and illustrating them too. Lots of fantastic effort this week!

Lewis

In Lewis class this week, we have been busy writing our leaflets using our theme learning about animals by grouping and classifying them according to what they eat and if they are vertebrates or invertebrates. In our maths learning, we have just started learning about the different methods of adding two, three and four digit numbers together. We have had lots of resilient tortoises, well done Lewis class!

Drake

After returning from an amazing week at Grenville (for more info on what happened, see the school website 'News'), where the children really excelled themselves in all activities, we were really excited to see what the children at school created; they had been extremely busy with Miss Keary and Mrs Dave creating a superb 3D model of the major organs and then writing about their sewing skills in English.



This week the children have been learning about the circulatory system in science which is then informing their writing of explanation texts in English (if all parents could return forms to give permission for videos/images online, then we can put the video of the children simulating the blood flowing around the body in which they drop off oxygen and collect carbon dioxide on to Drake's class page on the school website).



Next week Mathletics should be up and working so the children can work on specific areas each week to complete their homework and then participate in 'Live Mathletics' to try to get the certificates.
