<u>Geography – Caring for the Environment</u>

This week I would like you to do some research on all four areas so that you have a good idea about what you could focus on in more detail next week.

Computing – Searching the Internet Safely

That means that this week you only have to do a small amount of research on each area. Read some articles, watch some of the videos suggested and remember to search safely if you are researching yourself. Kiddle (<u>https://www.kiddle.co/</u>) is a great child-friendly search engine or you can use any other search engine you like but just add 'for kids' or 'KS2' at the end so that you go to an age-appropriate website. Save the Bees:

You could also investigate the different types of bees (or even flying insects) to see what 'jobs' they do for us – what is the point of a wasp? Maybe think that your piece next week could be promoting these disliked minibeasts so we will care for them more in the future.

Plant the Trees:

Trees are vitally important to the environment – but why? You could **research specific trees** and what is special about them; look at large rainforests – such as the Amazon – to see why they are called 'Planet Earth's Lungs'; Look at which trees are best to grow in your garden; what we use trees for; what we can do to help protect trees; or anything else tree related.

Maybe a raised bed? A bench? Or an art installation?
