Practise spelling the days of the week (don't forget they need a capital letter because they are proper nouns/names). Maybe you could create days of the week cards and practise shuffling them, then putting them back in the correct order.

Each time you work in your exercise book try writing the long date at the top. If you find this tricky get someone to write it for you and you could copy it.

Read the very hungry caterpillar or watch it (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=75NQK-Sm1YY).

Write down each day in the story and what happened on that day (you could video your child talking instead writing if writing is too difficult). If you were the very hungry caterpillar, what would you eat on each day?

Pick a day or a page from the very hungry caterpillar book and think about what day was it yesterday? What day will it be tomorrow? Pick a different page. What is he eating today? What will he eat tomorrow? What did he eat yesterday?
