Seacole (Years 1 and 2)

We have had a busy week in Seacole Class! We have been looking at a new book called The High Street and trying to remember all the different shops that the girl visited. In Maths, we have been focusing on addition and subtraction. We have been practicing all the different strategies to solve these calculations. As we move from

spring into summer, all are hard work with planting seeds is paying off! We have peas, potatoes and lots of salad leaves that are ready to plant out. We also had a chance to taste some of the things we have grown.



Lewis Class (Years 3 and 4)

Lewis class have been thinking about classifying living things based on their distinguishing features. We've discussed different vertebrate groups in the animal kingdom and have been very knowledgeable although certain species are a bit confusing (especially the platypus...)! This has linked to our new text in English, which is a series of non-chronological reports about intriguing animals. In maths, we've been recapping addition and sub-

traction facts and explaining our processes in finding missing numbers and solving problems. It's been surprising to lots of us how much of this comes back to our number bonds to 10!



Drake Class (Years 5 and 6)

This week in Drake Class we have looked at similarities and differences between the UK and South America. We have used the Chromebooks to look at satellite images at the landscapes and Streetview to see what places in South America look like at ground level. In English, the children have been reading a number of Traditional Tales and have listed to our class book: 'Blackberry Blue' to inspire them to write some really super sentences. In maths we have moved onto investigating the relationships between units of measurement - converting, adding and subtracting them. In PE the children used their skills

from a guest coaching session led by Mr Carpinini from Uffculme High School to really improve their playing.
