Willow Class (Pre-school)

Hello everybody and welcome back. It has been a very interesting and windy week!. We collected lots of leaves, conkers and broken sticks to create Autumn animal homes. We have also been exploring Remembrance Day themes by painting poppies, looking at the CBBC rabbit film and



talking about our families. Have a lovely weekend.

Oak Class (Reception and Year 1)

This week we have been learning about Remembrance Day and we have filled the classroom with poppies! In English, we have created acrostic poems with poppies as a focus and learned about the animals that helped in the war. The children were inspired to create a poppy stand in our role play area and spent a lot of time decorating with bunting. In art, the children were shown how to sew and

each made a poppy with buttons that they had picked out for the seeds in the centre. Our science focus this week has been habitats and we searched our outside area to see which animals might live in our school habitat.



Cedar Class (Year 2)

Cedar class have been learning about remembrance this week. The children have listened to and read some poems about remembrance, and



have written some of their own, as well as doing some great role play, interviewing each other as poppies! Our PE this term is dance, and I was really impressed with the concentration and imagination that the class showed.

Beech Class (Years 3 and 4)

Beech Class have spent the week diving back into their learning as if they were never away! Within maths, the children have been working with some large numbers both adding and subtracting. Our WW2 minitopic has taught the children about the importance of Winston Church Hill and his accomplishments as well as creating some heartfelt poems about the



Blitz. Finally, our P.E unit of work centres around mechanical dance movements and we have just begun to move to a beat in unison.

Ash Class (Years 5 and 6)

In Ash, this week we have been completing a mini-project on World War Two - linked to Remembrance next week. We have learnt about the main causes and events of the war and looked at photographs and videos from the war which have then inspired us to write some poetry in our English sessions. We have gathered vocabulary and then used it in a variety of forms to create our own poems. In art, we have been sewing some felt poppies and creat-

ing some Monet-inspired watercolours of poppy fields. In maths, we have completed our final week on the four number operations - with a focus on division. During our science session, we have begun our unit on electricity - creating circuits and drawing circuit diagrams to match.

We have also begun our new jazz unit in music; we are

learning to play both the recorder and the glocken-spiel to accompany the music with their own improvisations using just three notes.
