The school year is now well underway so here is some information about the expectations in the classroom.

Reading

Please read with your child at least 5 times a week. If your child finds it tricky to read to you, you could try reading to them a few times a week instead. Please record this in the reading journal by writing the date, signing your name and writing what book has been read. If your child found a word tricky you could record this in the reading journal too. The colour book that your child is reading is related to their RWI groups that they are in at school.

Reading records will be checked and books changed on a Friday afternoon. Your child will choose three books to take home with them.

Spelling:

We are looking into a new spelling scheme to start after half term.

Maths:

- Practise counting to and from 100 (try starting at different numbers!) •
- Practise counting in 2,5,10 (counting in 3's for a challenge)
- Name coins and notes. What can you buy with £1? How much money do we have all together?
- Practise adding and subtracting numbers. Do the numbers get smaller or bigger?

<u>PE</u>

Our PE session will be on Mondays. Their PE kit will need to stay in school for the whole half term and can be taken home for the half term to be washed. If the PE kit becomes dirty then we will send it home earlier.

Please remove jewellery or watches in the morning before school (this includes studded earings).

Also, throughout the week we will be enjoying Jump start Jonny and Yoga sessions.

Show and tell

We have a fun packed year of learning ahead of us! Please only bring in things to show that are related to our theme or topic. Whilst sharing these things it allows us a chance to learn from each other and also shows that you have been a web weaving spider by making links at home! Please leave all other home things at home.
