Willow Class (Pre-school)

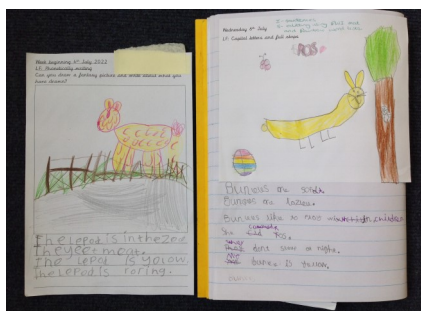

Oak Class (Reception and Year 1)

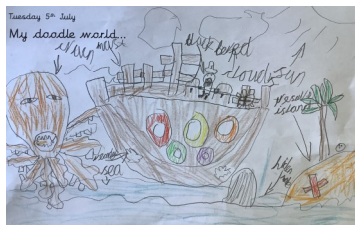
This has been a fun filled week in Oak Class. In English, we have been writing about a fantasy world



based on the book 'Daisy Doodles'. In maths, Reception have been looking at how to describe the way to move on a map and Year 1 have been gathering data and reporting it in different ways, including tally charts and pictograms. In Science, we have looked at what items are waterproof and Year 1 are designing an umbrella for a teddy bear. Reception children have been looking at trains. They have drawn a train and will be adding labels to it next week.

Cedar Class (Years 1 and 2)

This week we have been reading the book 'Daisy Doodles'. From this we created our own doodle world and have planned an adventure story



using our picture. Next week, we will be creating a comic strip using our story map. In maths, we have been practicing using directional language. We have been instructing our friends to move toy vehicles around the room and we have been using the mouse bots! On Wednesday afternoon, we were lucky enough to watch the KS2 play and we were so proud of our friends amazing performances!

Beech Class (Years 3 and 4)

Beech class have all been absolute superstars this week with all the rehearsals and performances! Although we've enjoyed the jazz hands, we're definitely looking forward to getting



back to a bit of normality next week... We've been busy telling the time in maths using analogue and 12- and 24-hour digital time with some sneaky Roman numerals thrown in too.
