term and have been noticing and talking about what we see on our way to Willow Class and the journey home. We have started our cooking experience with autumnal ingredients and have had great fun finding and picking the




last of the apples and fruit on the trees.

Cedar Class (Years 1 and 2)

In Cedar Class this week in maths, we have been focusing on number. We have been making numbers by counting objects, comparing numbers and practising counting forwards and backwards to one hundred. In English we have been creating amazing sentences, remembering our punctuation and capital letters. We have even been pretending



to be the characters in the Little Red Hen story to help us with our sentences. We have also continued to think about emotions and how we can support our friends with their emotions.

## Beech Class (Years 3 and 4)

Beech class have been exploring oil pastels this week, thinking about creating different tones and textures for beech tree images by using and layering colours in different ways. We've also written our first story of the year. which has been about jealousy. It was guite tricky to write in the style of the book we looked at because they just used present tense verbs in simple sentences. We're

looking forward to being able to include more description and different sentences in our next unit! In maths, we have been busy ordering and comparing 3and 4- digit numbers which has helped us



when looking at number lines with different scales.

### Ash Class (Years 5 and 6)

This week in Ash class the children have been continuing their great work in music by accompanying Bon Jovi's 'Livin' on a Prayer' with the glockenspiel. They are beginning to read basic sheet music and can appraise different songs by looking at their structure and use of instruments. In English the children have been using the ghost story 'Art' by Tony Ross to help them write their own spooky story. In RE we have pulled apart the 'Lord's Prayer' and rewritten it to help explain to younger children

what each means and have added illustrations. In PE we have improved our passing skills by playing some mini games focussing on our control and movement.
