Seacole (Years 1 and 2) This week we have started a new topic. We are thinking about how we can help the environment. Seacole class had loads of great ideas about how we can help animals and their habitats. We created posters with all these ideas on them. In Maths, we are revising multiplication and division. The children have



been practicing different strategies to solve multiplication and division guestions. In English we have started a new book called 'No- Bot The Robot with no bottom. In the book the robot looses his bottom and his friends help him to find it.

Lewis Class (Years 3 and 4)

Year 3/4 kick started this half term with World Ocean Day on Tuesday, which not only gave us some great ideas to use in English over the next 2 weeks but also linked into our science work on living



things and their habitats. We delved deeper into the threats to habitats on Thursday afternoon and began exploring the UN Sustainable Development Goal 15: Life on Land by looking at the different topics this covered and discussing the small changes we can make to help meet these. In maths, we're recapping our fractions work and Miss Holland has been really impressed that the key sentences used during lockdown learning have stuck with the children!

Drake Class (Years 5 and 6)

This week in Drake Class the children have begun their new topic on space and have a new text in English to study which is all about Ernest Shackleton's amazing adventure to Antarctica. The children have listened to the story and have written some great pieces of writing using emotive language. In maths we have been revisiting the four number operations - addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. In art we have begun looking at different printing techniques - starting with a technique called

pouncing where you make small pinholes in paper and dab charcoal through them to leave an image. We have also handed out the roles for the end of vear production so in the upcoming weeks we will be learning songs and lines in preparation! Next week we begin our new cricket topic in PE - don't forget PE kits on Monday.
