## English home learning tasks 6.7.20

Writing tasks (complete in order)

This week's learning will be based around a story called 'The Black Hat' by Maia Walczak. <u>https://www.literacyshed.com/blackhat.html</u>

## <u>Step 1</u>

Write a review of the short film.

- How many stars would you give it? (5 being amazing, 1 didn't like it)
- Plot: What happened in the film? Did you find the plot interesting?
- Who were the main characters? Did you like the main character?
- Did you like the film? What was your favourite part? Why?
- Would you recommend this film to a friend? Why?
- If you could, would you change anything about the film?

After you have written your review, get someone to ask you the question as if you were in an interview!

## Step 2

Conjunctions are joining words that link together parts of a sentence. The three main coordinating conjunctions are 'and', 'but' and 'or'.

<u>Step 3</u> Use these conjunctions to write sentences to answer these questions. **'and', 'but' and 'or'** How did the boy feel when the bird escaped?

animals in cages? Do you think it is right for circuses to keep animals in cages?

Step 5
Do you think animals should or shouldn't be kept in zoos or in circuses?

For example: It is good to have animals in zoos, so that they can have babies and increase their population.
Don't forget:
- use the correct punctuation (!,?.)
- re-read to check it makes sense and correct any mistakes.
- use neat cursive handwriting
- use commas in a list
- use conjunctions to extend your sentences (and, but, so , because, if, when)
Spelling
Practise your spellings that are highlighted on the spelling card. When you have learnt those move onto the next
spelling card. You could do this by rainbow writing, 'look cover write check' or by seeing how many times you can write
the word in a minute.
