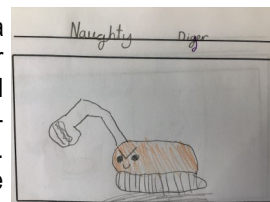
## Oak Class (Reception and Year 1)

In science we finished our topic on life cycles by looking at how humans change as they age and - after our visit from Katy with her bees - we were inspired to look at the life cycle of bees. Then, to cap the week off, we celebrated the Queen's Jubilee by painting our own portraits and baking scones for the cake sale after school after we looked at the real life maths behind the ratio of the recipe and the cost of materials.
