Oak Class (Reception and Year 1)

What a fantastic last week of the term. Within English, we have been looking at poetry. The reception children helped to come up with some ideas for a collective Spring poem for the Year 1's to write. Their poem was then read in Church at the Easter Service. In maths, Reception have been looking at patterns and creating simple patterns using various manipulative and the Year 1 children have been looking at volume and capacity. They have been predicting and then finding out how many cubes and how much water different containers can hold. We have also enjoyed some Spring

activities which have including: making shortbread biscuits and chocolate nests; creating bonnets for the parade and making Easter Cards.



Cedar Class (Years 1 and 2)

Another busy week in Cedar Cass to finish off a term which has flown by! We've been very Easter focussed this week; writing Spring themed poems; baking Easter cookies, retelling the

Beech Class have had another fun packed week full of learning! From painting, glazing and finalising their Anglo-Saxon jewellery to Easter Bonnet creating and cake making.



Within English, the children have spent time developing and writing their very own fictional stories - set within an abandoned setting. We have thoroughly enjoyed listening to the children's creative ideas and wild imaginations as a class. The children have also blended all their new netball skills together this week in a rapid 3 person attack game which they really enjoyed. Ash Class (Years 5 and 6)

This week we have been really busy baking! On Tuesday we made two types of bread: some pitta breads - linked to our work on the Island Golden Age; and a challah loaf - a bread often baked by Jewish people for their Friday night dinner. Then we baked six different batches of hot cross buns - chosen by the children. It was definitely a bake-off moment with the children being supplied with the ingredients and the method for them to use to work at their own pace. All of the children showed great teamwork and turn-taking during this exercise. All of the groups created delicious hot cross buns and they REAL-LY enjoyed tasting them to them evaluate. Alongside this we have completed our hybrid text based around Charles Darwin and his findings on evolution which linked nicely

to our work in science. We also completed our work in RE about the resurrection and presented our final pieces of work on the Stations of the Cross during the Easter service.
