#### **Darwin Class (Reception)**

We are absolutely thrilled, some of our butterflies have hatched in time for half-term! The children have been fascinated to watch them emerging and moving at last; it has helped to inspire lots of writing, including every children retelling the Very Hungry Caterpillar story! One

of the butterflies has a poorly wing, but this has been a wonderful opportunity to discuss the life cycle and for the children to show their incredibly caring side, including finding it some flowers and sugar water to help revive it if possible. What a wonderful end to a very busy half-term!



#### Seacole (Years 1 and 2)

This week in Seacole class we finished our High street topic by writing our own High street story. We created a character that went shopping in the different shops on our high street. We had great fun describing all the amazing things in each shop. Also this week have been practicing telling the time. Your child should have brought home a 'Time - Knowledge organiser' that has all the information they need to know this year. Keep practicing telling the time at home!



#### Lewis Class (Years 3 and 4)

Year 3/4 took advantage of the sunshine this week and went outside for our session on multiplying and dividing by 10 and 100, physically moving the correct number of places in our place value grids. During English, we've been starting to look at letters written to and from an agony aunt, which has also been in keeping with our

animals and habitats unit in science. In PE, we've been busy practising lots of different athletic skills and this week we looked at throwing for accuracy and distance as part of our activity carousel.



#### Drake Class (Years 5 and 6)

Drake Class have made some fantastic Frida Kahlo box frames in their Design technology sessions. We have been sawing wood to specific lengths, gluing joints and trying to make it square. The children had to use all their learning powers to complete them - especially being resilient tortoises! I think you'll agree that they look fantastic and they should all be proud of what they achieved. In science this week, we have looked at more forces and in English, the children designed and wrote about their own Wallace and Gromit style 'Cracking Contraptions'. In Maths, we capped off the term with some more fraction and percentage knowledge and in PE the children had an opportunity to play some doubles games using the whole
