Willow Class (Pre-school)

Hello everybody and welcome back. Our new topic is 'Wonderful Weather' which we are very excited about, especially as we have been exploring Spring time. Our school start-



er/ readiness groups have started with Mrs Goodchild, which we are really enjoying. We have been taking part in lots of gross/fine motor activities linked with water and outside experiences as well as 'Leap into Life' activities in the hall. Time to get moving.

Oak Class (Reception)

We have had a fantastic first week back to start the Summer Term and we are so glad to have some sunshine out as we begin our topic on 'Wonderful Weather'. In Maths, we have been learning about patterns and practiced creating patterns with colours and movements. We have enjoyed reading weather themed books such as 'Storm' and talking about how weather all over the world can vary. We have begun to learn some weather themed songs such as 'I hear Thunder' and 'I can sing a rainbow'.



Cedar Class (Year 1 and 2)

It has been lovely to have our Cedar Class family back together this week! In English, we are starting our new book about a Yeti who doesn't have any friends. This has led us neatly into talking about what makes a good friend and how to help others who find making friends tricky. We are continuing our topic on money in maths and the children are learning to calculate with notes and coins, find different ways to make £1 and find change. In RE, we have learnt the story of David and Goliath and how this story and others from the Old Testament are important to Jewish people.



Beech Class (Years 3 and 4)

Our students have seamlessly transitioned back into their school routines and are thriving in their learning environment. They have particularly enjoyed diving into our new text, 'The Baker by the Sea', which has sparked their imagination and curiosity. Additionally, their enthusiasm for our PSHE topics, especially fire safety, has been remarkable. It's wonderful to see them so engaged and eager to learn!



Ash Class (Years 5 and 6)

Despite only being a four day week, we have hit the ground running with Year 5 children heading to London for our 3-day residential. They have been looking at the language around finance and also thinking about future enterprise and job roles. They have also been improving their grammar and writing skills as well as working on their arithmetic.
