Willow Class (Pre-school)

Hello everybody, we hope you are well. It's been another action packed week of play and learning across the setting. We have continued with our



Autumn interest with stories and poems, and have really enjoyed creating a huge conker run. The children are telling us about the library book they are taking home and have enjoyed sharing their Autumn experiences on Tapestry. Have a peaceful half term and we will see you all when we return.

Oak Class (Reception and Year 1)

What a fantastic first half term we have had in Oak Class! We finished off our English this term by reading 'Look Up!' and learning about space. The children have impressed me with their knowledge and curiosity about astronauts. We wrote letters to our main character, Rocket, and created our own stories where we wanted to share a special event with others. In Science, we have been learning about food chains and

what animals eat; we enjoyed beginning to think about what habitats these animals live in too. Over the past few weeks, the children have been working with clay in art to create their own bowls and explore patterns using natural items.



Cedar Class (Year 2)

Cedar have been finding out facts about wolves, and writing non-chronological reports on them. Ask your child how many teeth a wolf has! In science, we explored food



chains, and investigated where our own food comes from. Maths has been all about adding and subtracting, with some great perseverance being shown across the class! We all enjoyed Just One Tree Day, and learnt about how trees are vital habitats for lots of animals.

Beech Class (Years 3 and 4)

The children have had a fantastic two weeks at school. Our English text has emersed the children's imaginations into the realms of folk tales and myths; ask your child about a mysteri-



ous figure that appeared in the classroom last week! The mermaid in question, has her own calving on an ancient church bench end. The church is situated in the Cornish town of Zennor. It could be fun to research the tale together. Within geography, the children created their own river systems and attempted to label the features of the river recalling previously taught knowledge – more details can be found on our website here. Finally, the children have been applying all their newly found Dodgeball skills within our P.E sessions. I have been so impressed with their teamwork, honesty and courage. Have a fantastic break and we look forward to seeing you after half term.

Ash Class (Years 5 and 6)

Over the past two weeks, we have been reading the story 'Robot Girl' by Malorie Blackman which has really got them talking about predicting the story as well as influencing their writing. In maths, we have been looking at multiplication - from squared and cubed numbers; to factors and multiples; to short and long multiplication. In geography, we have finished investigating aguatic biomes by focusing on marine biomes (saltwater) both in Devon and the UK as well as around the World. In science, we completed experiments which investigated what speeds up corrosion and how other changes are irreversible. In PE, we showed our footballing skills by completing a round-robin of activities which included playing some mini games to see the progression of our skills. All this has happened alongside the children producing some wonderful artwork with Mrs Davé and summing up our findings in RE linked to the Kingdom of God. We're now looking forward to recharging our batteries ready for

the second half of the Autumn term.
