Willow Class (Pre-school)

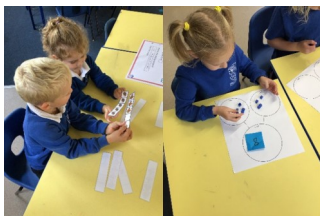
Hello everyone, we hope you are all well. It has been a very busy and exciting week this week. We have welcomed Mrs Bennett to our class and have been carrying on with our super Autumn activities. This has included lots of sorting and counting of tasty Autumn treats; continuing work on our



giant Autumn freeze and some Autumn cooking! Willow class library is returning from next week and details are to follow.

Oak Class (Reception and Year 1)

What a busy week we have had in Oak Class. In English, we started looking at a non-fiction book 'The Big Book of the Blue' by Yuval Zommer. We began looking at how it is laid out and enjoyed finding out lots of facts about different sea creatures. We have also been thinking of questions about the different sea creatures in the book. In maths, Reception have been looking at comparing amounts to 5 and using the vocabulary 'more', 'less', 'bigger' and 'smaller'. Year 1 have been looking at how we can partition numbers, using part-whole models. As part of geography, in our continents and oceans topic, we have been looking different oceans and comparing the climate, plant life and animals found in each.



Cedar Class (Years 1 and 2)

Cedar class have been exploring different methods of mono-printing with Miss Keary recently, all inspired by Hokusai's Great Wave. In geography, we've continued looking at our planet and have learnt the names of the 5 oceans, as well as discussing and comparing some key features of the Pacific and Atlantic Oceans. In maths, we have been starting to look at addition and subtraction, making sure we are confident with finding parts and wholes in number fact families. This week, we began looking at our non-fiction text, 'The Big Book of the Blue' by Yuval Zommer, and have enjoyed finding out lots of facts about different sea creatures. Challenge us to tell you what type of non-fiction text it is!



Beech Class (Years 3 and 4)

This week the children have begun to understand Hinduism in much more detail. They have looked at the circle of life through the Trimurti of Brahman, linking creation, preservation and destruction. In Maths, the children have now completed their Place Value unit of work and we are swiftly moving into addition and subtraction of numbers up to 4 digits! Within science, the children have been learning all about different types of rocks and how they are formed, with many children have bringing in fine examples to share with the other children. Finally, some of the children took part in the cross-country event and we are very proud of the effort and determination each child put in on the day.



Ash Class (Years 5 and 6)

Over the past few weeks, the children in Ash class have moved onto investigating and improving their skills in the four number operations. They completed their narrative stories and have now moved onto looking at writing a non-fiction text about ocean currents and how the Great Pacific Garbage Patch has been created; this is linked to our current geography topic so they will be using the knowledge gained in these sessions to influence their writing. In RE, we have been looking at the five pillars of Islam in more detail - the children have been really inquisitive about the Hajj pilgrimage. In PE, they have been improving their tag rugby skills and have now progressed onto playing mini games - following all or a number of the rules of the game. We were also really proud of the children in our class who, over the past two weeks, have taken part in the Harvest Festival, Killerton Cross-country and Basketball at Uffculme!
