I was fortunate to join our Year 6 children for part of their residential visit, where they truly embodied our school values—especially

Our youngest learners have also made a fantastic start to their learning journey in Early Years. It has been wonderful to see how confidently they have settled into their new environment, exploring, playing, and engaging with enthusiasm.

Willow Class (Pre-school)

Hello everybody. It has been another great week of

play and learning across Early Years. We are continuing to explore new routines, build friendships and develop resilience and independence in Willow. Through having exciting and inspiring activities the children are settling really well into their Early Years journey. Our topic continues to be



"All about me" and we have been exploring building house and homes. We have also enjoyed being active and moving with lots of movement activities both inside and out.

Oak Class (Reception)

Another busy fortnight in Oak as we have begun our learning in lots of different topics. This week, we started learning to blend sounds together to start reading words with Fred as well as continuing with single letter sounds. We linked our maths and science together by sorting autumn leaves based on secret rules our

friends created. In geography, we have looked at where we are in the world and what other schools look like. Outside we have been working together, building using sand cement to hold the bricks together and placing them together to make it sturdy base.



Cedar Class (Year 1 and 2)

Cedar Class have been working really hard and showing great enthusiasm in their learning already this term. In Maths, we have been investigating numbers, exploring further what we know about 1 more and 1 less to build our number confidence. In English, we have been captivated by the story of *Cave Baby* and particularly enjoyed taking



on the roles of the different animals. As Geographers, we have begun exploring the United Kingdom, with the children learning all sorts of interesting facts. Please help your child to learn the countries of the UK and their capitals at home. It is wonderful to see them so engaged and excited to learn!

Beech Class (Years 3 and 4)

Over the past two weeks, the children have thoroughly enjoyed deepening their understanding of number through our focus on place value. They have actively engaged in handson learning, using a wide range of concrete resources in the classroom to explore and represent



numbers in different ways. In English, we have been diving into the imaginative world of *Leon and the Place Between*, which has sparked some fantastic discussions and creative writing. The children have also been developing their artistic skills by exploring prehistoric influences, creating expressive and textured artwork inspired by ancient cave paintings and early human creativity.

Ash Class (Years 5 and 6)

We have had a fantastic couple of weeks packed full of activities. Not only are the Year 6s off on their residential at Grenville House, but we also had LD Active running an amazing Ultimate Frisbee session and Exeter City RTC ran their second football session. We have now begun all of our new topics for each lesson - 80s rock being our

focus in music. Whilst the Year 6s have been away, Mrs Davé has been teaching the children about the oceans of the world and investigating solutions in science.
