Topic - Once Upon a Time! - March

Activities to enrich at home:

Reading: Please read 5 times a week. The books

coming home in the Spring term will increase in length

and difficulty; remember to read once for decoding, twice for fluency
and three times for comprehension!


Phonics: We have now finished Set 2, and will be revising it alongside learning new sounds from Set 3. Please now refer to the Set 3 Speeds Sounds book your child will come home with; on Fridays, Tapestry will update with any new sounds we have learnt.



Art: We are going to be thinking about the characters we meet in fairy-tales; sometimes they are good, sometimes they are bad. Think of one of each and represent them; perhaps you could make a collage, or a drawing! Make sure you show how one is mean and one is good...

Maths: We are going to learn all about addition and subtraction! First, try writing numerals between II-20 - try writing them in sand, on paper or steam on the mirror! Then, use everyday objects around the house to try and add two amounts together; then take away an amount to see what's left!





C&L/Writing: We are heading into an important time where we write sentences of increasing length and connect several sentences! Fairy-tales are full of language which we will reflect in our writing. Read some stories to your child and see if they can use this to inspire some sentence writing - perhaps they could imagine a new ending? Or write some speech for the characters?

If you would like to learn about what an expected writer looks like in Reception, please speak to Miss Dillon; the children are currently being challenged to write sentences using capital letters, full stops and finger spaces.
